



INFANT AND EARLY MENTAL HEALTH CARE PATHWAYS

SUPPLEMENTARY DOCUMENT

HASTINGS PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY

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Context

The purpose of Infant and Early Mental Health (IEMH) Care Pathways initiative is to create equitable, navigable systems of care pathways for infant and early mental health in Canada. Canada's current approach to promoting positive mental health and wellbeing fails to recognize IEMH concerns and offer early interventions before school age.

Canadian practitioners receive little to no training on children's mental health, especially IEMH, and access to professional development in this area is extremely limited (Hicks et al., 2022; Rodger et al., 2014). Additionally, with no clear direction for both families and practitioners on how to navigate the supports addressing IEMH, young children that require services may not be referred to the right resources or may not receive the right resources at the right time (McCain, 2020; Peterson-Katz, 2023).

The combination of practitioners often failing to recognize vulnerability early on and the absence of navigable systems of care pathways to recognize and treat IEMH concerns in Canada prevents children from birth to six from receiving the support they need. Instead, most children are not identified with mental health concerns before school age and, as such, don't receive services until they enter the school system. Providing services after the critical period of brain plasticity has passed is not ideal, as many mental health challenges become more complex the longer they are untreated (Cressman et al., 2020; Nelson et al., 2024; Public Health Ontario, 2024; Thomson et al., 2019).

The expected outcomes for this initiative include the following:

- Developing and implementing aspirational IEMH Care Pathways
- Transforming mental health in the early years with integrated care
- Strengthening the implementation of culturally safe interventions for diverse populations
- Catalyzing interdisciplinary and cross-sectoral collaborations

- Building and fostering implementation of science, research, and knowledge mobilization
- Ensuring meaningful representation and participation of individuals who have historically faced barriers in research

Development of the IEMH Care Pathways

The IEMH Care Pathways were developed in collaboration with community agency partners who support children birth to six in your community. They were invited to be a part of this initiative and over the course of several years engaged in various activities to develop the IEMH Care Pathways.

As part of the IEMH Care Pathways initiative, agencies have committed to:

- Following the IEMH Care Pathways maps
- Utilizing the Ages and Stages Questionnaires (ASQs) in their practice to screen children
- Contributing anonymized ASQ data to the Canadian Database of Development, Infancy to Six (CanDDIS), the first Canadian database of child development for children from birth to six
 - *Only applies to agencies that have signed up to participate and completed the research ethics requirements to be a part of the CanDDIS*

Purpose

This document is intended to supplement the IEMH Care Pathways maps that were developed for your community. The various roles of agencies, instructions on how to utilize the map, additional information regarding services and supports in the community, and contact information for further support can be found here.

Definitions

Roles

Community Partners: Community leaders from local organizations that provide supports and services for children from birth to six years of age that were invited to be a part of this initiative. They provided insight into the current services and supports in the community, as well as the strengths and challenges with current systems.

Local Pathways Implementation Team: Small core group of community leaders who act as leads for the planning, development, and implementation of the IEMH Care Pathways.

Practitioners: Anyone in the community who works with or supports families with young children from birth to six years of age.

Family/Caregivers: Anyone with a caregiving role to at least one child from birth to six years of age.

Terminology

Ages and Stages Questionnaires (ASQs): A reliable and valid developmental (ASQ-3) and social-emotional (ASQ:SE-2) screening tool developed by Brookes Publishing for children between birth to six years of age. The tool is used to track children's development, identify risk for developmental delays, and help identify next steps for support and/or follow-up actions. Designed as a caregiver-report tool, caregivers respond to the questions and trained practitioners score the responses to identify areas of developmental and/or social-emotional need. **ASQs are not** diagnostic tools. Developmental Support Plans (DSPs): A resource developed by Infant and Early Mental Health Promotion (IEMHP), a program under The Hospital for Sick Children. It is a strength-based resource that:

- identifies a developmental goal for the child according to the five developmental domains identified in the ASQ-3,
- provides multiple tailored strategies caregivers can implement in their day-to-day life with their child, and
- an explanation as to the significance of achieving the developmental goal.

Practitioners can provide the DSP to families regardless of whether the child requires intensive services or not; it is **not** a treatment plan or a replacement for intensive services or support. DSPs can only be created by individuals who are trained in DSP development and administration. To receive training on the DSP, please contact IEMHP at iemhp.mail@sickkids.ca.

Early Intervention: Services, supports, and resources in response to one or more specific developmental, behavioral, or mental health concerns which aim to minimize risk and the development of further challenges through strengthening capacity within the child, caregiver, and relationship.

Prevention: Services, supports, and resources which seek to increase support and protective factors, improve determinants of health, and mitigate risk factors and relational adversity that can influence a child's mental health and development.

Promotion: Universally accessible services, supports, and resources that encourage optimal early mental health and wellbeing during prenatal, infancy, toddlerhood, and early childhood periods through positive and culturally safe environments, experiences, and relationships.

Treatment: Services, supports, and resources for an identified challenge or diagnosed condition that aims to reduce the intensity and improve developmental, mental health and/or behavioural outcomes.

IEMH Care Pathways

Geographic Regions

The community determined that HPE required 5 maps to represent how services and supports are delivered and accessed in the community. Each of the maps represent a different geographic location:

- North Hastings
- Belleville and East
- Prince Edward Counties (PEC)
- Quinte West
- Centre Hastings

Depending on which area your agency operates or the family lives, please use the appropriate map as per your discretion. For example:

- If your agency only serves the West region of HPE, use and follow the Quinte West map when supporting families with young children.
- If your agency serves and supports the North, East, and Central regions of HPE, and the family you are supporting lives in the East, use and follow the Belleville and East map when supporting that family.
